Please note: In 2021, the government of Turkey changed the spelling of the country's name to Türkiye (pronounced *Tur-kee-yeah*) through the United Nations. On 5 January 2023, a US State Department spokesman made the following announcement: "The Board on Geographic Names retained both 'Turkey' and 'Republic of Turkey', the previous spelling, as conventional names, as these are more widely understood by the American public. The department will use the spelling that you saw today [Türkiye] in most of our formal diplomatic and bilateral contexts, including in public communications, but the conventional name can also be used if it is in furtherance of broader public understanding." This learning resource acknowledges the change of official name but uses the conventional spelling of the country's name.

ARGENTINA

Argentina is located on the eastern coast of South America. It is the eighth largest country in the world and the second largest in South America after Brazil. The country



is bordered by Chile to the west, Bolivia and Paraguay to the north, Brazil to the northeast, Uruguay and the South Atlantic Ocean to the east, and the Drake Passage to the south. The country has a diverse landscape that includes the Andes Mountains in the west, the flat Pampas grasslands in the center, and subtropical forests in the northeast.

The climate in Argentina is mainly temperate and arid, but it can vary from tropical in the north to subpolar in the south. The population of

Argentina is over 44 million people. Spanish is the official language, although many people also speak Italian and German.

The capital city is Buenos Aires. Other important cities include Cordoba, Rosario, Mendoza, and Mar del Plata. The currency used in Argentina is the Argentine peso. Argentine cuisine is known for its beef and wine, and is also influenced by Italian and Spanish cuisine. Music is an important part of Argentine culture and includes genres such as tango, folk, and rock.

Tourist attractions in Argentina include the Iguazu Falls, the Andes Mountains, the Perito Moreno glacier, and the city of Buenos Aires itself.

Argentina was a major destination for immigrants during the late 19th and early 20th centuries. Political and economic instability during the 20th century led to periods of military dictatorship and economic crisis. In recent years, the government has taken steps to improve the economy and restore stability, leading to a resurgence of hope for a bright future.
